CALL FOR PRESENTATIONS

DEADLINE: June 1, 2017

The 2017 Illinois Problem-Oriented Policing Conference will be September 21-22, 2017 at the Embassy Suites Hotel in East Peoria, Illinois.

The annual *Illinois Problem-Oriented Policing Conference* is designed to bring law enforcement executives, managers, and supervisors together to examine critical issues that challenge today's law enforcement organization.

Problem-Oriented Policing emphasizes the need to engage both internally and externally in a number of areas.

Speaker proposals will be accepted under the categories listed below. Deadline to submit proposals is **June 1, 2017**. All submissions must be made online.

Categories for the 2017 conference include but are not limited to:

- Social Service Issues (e.g. Homelessness, Non-Transient and Response to Persons with Mental Illness, Heroin and Prescription Drugs, Alcohol-Related Violence)
- Organizational Transformation (e.g. Information Sharing in Agencies, Role of Field Training in POP Model)
- Real-Estate Related Issues (e.g. Foreclosed properties, Owner-occupied, Crime-free Housing, Burglary Reduction, Metal Theft)
- Combating the Erosion of Public Confidence in Police
- POP Implementation Issues (e.g. Successes, Budgetary Constraints, Integration in COPS)
- Crime Analysis (e.g. Successes, Use of Social Media for Analysis, Police Efficiency)
- Communities (e.g. Interaction, Use of Information During Large Disturbances, Crime Prevention through Environmental Design, Policing in a College Town)
- Technology (e.g. Sexting Investigations, New Technology, Impact of Body-Cameras, Stalking, Cell Phone Larceny)

Conference Date and Location

The conference will be held September 21-22, 2017 at the Embassy Suites Hotel in East Peoria, IL.

Selection Criteria

Presentation selection is based on the following criteria:

- Topical relevance to the identified categories and Problem-Oriented Policing concepts
- Clear statement of relevance to objectives of Problem-Oriented Policing (for more information see <http://www.popcenter.org/about/?p=elements>)
- Identification of how the initiative/presentation fits into the SARA model (for more information see <http://www.popcenter.org/about/?p=sara>)
- Description of how attendees may benefit from the presentation
- Original work of the presenter
- Speaker's topic expertise and knowledge
- Speaker's presentation experience and skill level

Submission

Presenter Selection

Selection of presenters will be announced via e-mail on or before **June 15, 2017**. Selected presenters must confirm their commitment to present by July 1, 2017. Corresponding papers and/or presentations may be published by the ILETSEI following the 2017 conference.

- Presenters will be offered a 50% reduced registration fee to attend the entire conference
