The first-line supervisor has never been more important in the field of law enforcement. Organizations have increased internal and external success by developing a management continuum that includes first-line supervisors.

This course focuses on the function, effectiveness, proficiency and influence on creating an effective criminal justice agency. A hybrid learning experience, participants will meet for three weeks of traditional classroom instruction with individual and group participation, online learning modules and written assignments including case studies, the SARA model, personal leadership philosophy and comprehensive supervision plans. Persons successfully completing the course will receive 200 hours of training credit.
